Who We Are

The American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (AHEPA) is the largest Greek-American fraternal and philanthropic organization with chapters in the United States, Canada, Australia and Greece. AHEPA was founded in 1922 in Atlanta to help assimilate immigrant Greeks into American society. The Daughters of Penelope, the women's affiliate organization of AHEPA, was founded in San Francisco in 1929, to improve the standing of Greek women in American society and to instill a sense of civic responsibility and philanthropy. Daughters of Penelope is a leader in philanthropic, educational and cultural activities with local chapters in the United States, Canada and Greece. Sons of Pericles is the Young Men's affiliate with the same mission as AHEPA. The organizations are non-partisan and non-denominational. Locally, AHEPA donates up to \$10,000 in **Scholarships** annually and assists a number of local philanthropic organizations. The mission of AHEPA is to promote Hellenism, Education, Philanthropy, Brotherhood and Family.
